Trunks up to 24 inches in diameter and no longer than 5 feet



Shrub and yard waste

These materials must be separated from other compost items

Pampas grass and shrubbery go with these items.



Facts about Composting

Composting is a practical, convenient and least expensive way to dispose of yard waste such as leaves, grass, thatch, chipped brush, plant cuttings and small prunings.

Compost improves your soil and the plants growing in it.

Compost returns organic matter to the soil in a usable form.

The use of compost can also reduce the use of pesticides and chemical fertilizers in your yard.



Did you know...?

Yard waste accounts for nearly one-quarter of the average person's residential waste stream.

Composting and recycling recovered 24% of our municipal solid waste. That's around 49 million tons!
